WHAT ARE SHIP-TO-SHORE CRANES?

These giant cranes sit right on the dock and reach out over the water to load and unload big ships in the Port of Charleston. They pick up huge containers and can lift them as high as 155 feet. *That's taller than a 10-story building!*

Each crane is a super-strong machine with a long arm and special hooks that grab containers and move them safely on and off ships. Because of these powerful cranes, we can welcome some of the biggest ships ever to visit Charleston.

OFFICIAL RULES

- Students in grades K -5, enrolled in Charleston, Berkeley, and Dorchester County School Districts are eligible to enter the contest.
- Each student may enter one name.
- In the event of identical names, the first entry received will be counted.
